Sr.No.	Month	Activity	Modus Operandi	Outcome
1	April	Extempore	After teaching for 15-20 minutes student will be given topics. Giving them time for two minutes (to think), randomly some of the students can be asked to speak.	Spontaneous speaking and presence of mind will be improved, along with the fear of public speaking.
2	July	Debate	Assuming 40 students in a class, the class can be divided into 8 groups. The debate will be in the form of penal discussion, where each child will get chance to speak. (The first group vs. second group that is 10 students will take part in the first slot of the debate. In four slots each student will get a chance to speak.) Just after the teaching of 15 to 20 minutes, this discussion can be kept as per the convenience of the teacher.	Fluency in English, co-ordination, mutual understanding, maintaining discipline and decorum while discussing in the group will be improved.
3	August	Role Play	The topics will be taken by the groups of students. They will select a topic or situation and will perform in front of the class. Points to remember: Each group can have maximum 5 members. Each student must get chance to speak while performing role play. The students will get liberty to choose their group members,	Communication skills, the voice modulation as per the requirement of the role play will be enhanced. The fear of public speaking will also be removed.
4	October	Dictionary Activity	While teaching a chapter, the students will be asked to search the meaning of the words. Every now and then they will be asked to do so. Initially they will be given 30 seconds to search the meaning of the word. Gradually the time limit will be decreased up to 10 seconds. This practice can be given throughout the session.	The students will be skilled in searching the words from the dictionary.
5	November	Speak on a Topic	After the teaching of 15 to 20 minutes this activity can be taken for the rest of the time in the particular period. The students will be given a few topics to prepare with the next few minutes. Then randomly they will be called as per the time available.	The students will acquire the skills of public speaking as well as command on the language.
6	December	Listening Activity	The teacher will read a passage twice in the class. The students will listen to it and will answer the question given to them.	The students will be able to listen more attentively in the class. It will improve their listening skills and memory power.
7	January	Story Framing	The students can be given an outline or the beginning of the story. They must be allowed to frame the story in their own way.	The ability of expression will be improved.
